

In 2005, MaineHousing created or supported 2,048 full-time equivalent jobs statewide through its first-time homebuyer, weatherization and home repair, affordable housing development and construction, heating assistance, and rental assistance programs, along with its services for people who are homeless, and other initiatives. MaineHousing's expenditures finance its mission in these and other ways:
